

THE TOWN OF DAYTON INDIANA

THE DAYTON TOWN COUNCIL MET MAY 7, 2012 AT 7PM IN THE DAYTON TOWN HALL. COUNCIL MEMBERS PRESENT WERE MIKE HARRIS, JOHN SWICK, DAVE LEININGER AND TAMMI NICE. CHERYL KNODLE, TOWN ATTORNEY WAS ALSO PRESENT.

Mr. Harris called the meeting to order.

Mr. Swick made a motion to approve April 2, 2012 and April 9, 2012 and April 16, 2012 minutes as written. Mr. Leininger seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Mr. Swick made a motion to approve the registry of claims. Mr. Leininger seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Mr. Swick made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2012-3, "Transfer from the Economic Development Income Tax Fund to the Motor Vehicle Highway fund". Mr. Leininger seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Mr. Swick read Ordinance 2012-4, "An Ordinance Amending Zoning Ordinance". Mr. Leininger made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2012-4. Mr. Swick seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Ms. Brown handed out copies of the 2012 proposed budget. She explained that we would go over the budget at the June 2012 and at the July 2012 meeting.

Mr. Hanjie gave the police report which was downloaded and attached to the minutes.

Mr. Leininger asked Mr. Hanjie for the GPS report. Mr. Hanjie said that he had the copies done but had forgot to bring them to the meeting.

Mr. Hanjie said that the Dayton Police issue about eight gun permits per month. He said that there are about 240 gun permits issued in the town. Mr. Hanjie handed out the Dayton Police Rules/ Regulations/ Policy- "A Child is Missing". This policy would establish an orderly and uniform process for the use of A Child is Missing Alert Program. Mr. Leininger said that this is a valuable tool and would be great to implement. Mr. Swick made a motion to adopt "A Child is Missing /Dayton Police alert policy. Ms. Nice seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Mr. Hanjie handed out a correction replacement sheet for page 20 of the "Dayton Police Rules/ Regulations/ Policy". Mr. Swick made a

motion to accept the changes on page 20 of the Dayton Police Policy book. Mr. Leininger seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Ms. Nice explained the process involved in the interviewing and hiring of the new Town Marshal. The Town Board set an Executive Session for the discussion and interview of the Town Marshal for Monday 14, 2012 at 6:30 pm.

Mr. Bowman spoke on several issues. First he asked if the town could just fix the holes in all the streets instead of repaving just a few entire streets. Mr. Bowman said that 746 Walnut Street needs siding put on the house. He explained that the remodeling has been going on for three years or more. He then said that trucks and cars were parking in the alley between the liquor store and Perigo Auto Sales. The vehicles blocked the alley so no one could get through. Could "No Parking" signs and a Speed Limit sign be put up in the alley?

Mr. Shockey of 708 Walnut Street voiced a complaint about "SS Trucking". He said that they were coming in and out of their business at all hours of the morning and night, between 4:00 AM and midnight. They had large gas and diesel tanker trucks that using Republican Street and driving through a "Residential use" area of town. They had at least three large tanker trucks. Mr. Shockey then complained that the house at 706 Walnut Street, which was a rental, looked like a slumlord house and the place looked terrible.

Mr. Bumbleburg asked who does the fire inspection in Dayton. Mr. Hanjie said that the fire department handled that.

Mr. Whitlock asked the Town Board to buy a new meter reading system for around \$5,000. Our present system is on its last legs. Mr. Swick made a motion to purchase a new water meter reading system for the town. Ms. Nice seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The Town Board talked about the graffiti on a couple buildings and what to do about removing the paint. Ms. Nice said that she would write up an ordinance to cover this problem. Mr. Hanjie said that if the paint is provided that the community correction people will provide the labor.

Mr. Swick made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Leininger seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned.
