

THE TOWN OF DAYTON INDIANA

The Dayton Town Council met Tuesday September 1, 2015 for an Open-Door Special Session at the Town Hall at 8 AM. Members present were Ashley Stevenson, John Swick, and Tyrone Taylor. Mr. Harris and Ms. Nice were absent. Town Attorney, Joe Bumbleburg was present. This meeting was for the discussion of the golf cart ordinance. This is an open door meeting. Ind. Code 5-14-1.5-6.1

Mr. Swick called the meeting to order.

Mr. Swick opened the meeting up for comments about the golf cart ordinance.

Marshal Taylor, the residents, and the town council discussed in detail the golf cart ordinance 2015-5.

Mr. Stevenson made a motion to adopt ordinance 2015-5, "An Ordinance Establishing and Regulating the Licensing and Operation of Golf Carts Within Town Limits of the Town of Dayton, Indiana.

Mr. Taylor seconded the motion.

Mr. Swick asked for comments from the audience.

The residents and the council discussed in detail the golf cart ordinance.

They discussed also lower yearly fees, extended evening hours, and inspections. The residents thanked the town council and committee for all the time and effort in crafting the golf cart ordinance.

Mr. Stevenson thanked the golf cart committee and the residents for a good job.

Mr. Taylor said that this was a good ordinance and that the majority of the people wanted it.

Mr. Swick said that he was happy with the new ordinance results now, but at first was concerned with the safety issue for the town residents.

Mr. Bumbleburg explained how the ordinance was a joint effort between the residents, the council, the committee, the legal staff and how many hours of work that goes into completing the ordinance. He explained that later on the ordinance can easily be changed if need be.

Mr. Swick asked for a vote on ordinance 2015-5, "An Ordinance Establishing and Regulating the Licensing and Operation of Golf Carts Within Town Limits of the Town Of Dayton, Indiana". A vote of three in favor was recorded and the motion carried.

Mr. Swick explained the next steps that are involved to finalize the golf cart ordinance at the next meeting on September 14, 2015. Mr. Bumbleburg said that at the next meeting the ordinance can be amended if necessary. Then advertise the ordinance on 9-15-2015 with the Journal and Courier. Then the ordinance will not take effect until 30 days after the publication.

Mr. Koehler explained a wedding event for Ms. Taylor at the town gazebo on September 12, 2015. What requirements were needed? The council answered that she needed to put down \$100 refundable deposit and show proof of liability.

Mr. Koehler asked to supervise and put up the flags for Dayton as he has for the last fifteen years. Mr. Swick made a motion to have Mr. Koehler do the flags. Mr. Stevenson seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Mr. Taylor made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Stevenson seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned.
